- **Next steps**

- **Professional Development webinar brainstorming follow up**
  - We discussed that this list is huge and most of this work isn't a one-hour session can be all day.
  - Could we use some of these ideas for service learning for the Cohorts?
  - Alissa will pull the workforce assessment poll and compare the list to see where we can begin shaping out these sessions- keeping in mind the multilanguage need
  - Be mindful of how we ask or identify partners by who they work for, who pays them and how influence can impact our collective efforts.
  - Denise shared an idea--How can we include others in the community- ie entrepreneurs who can help us with looking at our community health and sponsorship opportunities for our cooking courses? Leverage entrepreneurs and their following (social media influences, etc) AND we build a healthier community through sharing with one another.
    - Be mindful of conflict of interest on who (entrepreneurs) who may try to “Sell” their products that take from the education piece

- Webinar 1- COVID testing, prevention and vaccine hesitancy
- Ideas:
  - Grief support, asthma mgmt., mental health, supervisory training, child tax credit, maternal health, domestic violence, rural/ farmworker health
  - One Health WHO concept (animal, human, environment)- what is this connection amongst the three
  - Digital literacy trainings: how to set up vmail, outlook knowledge, documenting in EHRs
  - Working with Multilanguage individuals
  - Conflict management- when media confronts them, authoritative confrontation and how to manage conversation.
  - Necessary skill- motivational interviewing (annually?)
  - Mental health first aid
  - ID outcomes and measures for your internal teams
    - Success stories- how to tell your own
  - Food insecurity
  - Community capacity vs individual capacity
  - How to set clear boundaries

- Increase access to health foods
  - Child development- know when a child needs to be assessed. KDHE Bureau of Family Health has a presentation/training (add this to LearnWorld System for participant to receive cert of completion—same with oral health and breastfeeding ed)

  - Trauma informed care---try to have this recorded for this type of need vs not having it recorded
