- **CHW Module Update**

- Spanish Cohort- Pilot? Timeline? Task Committee?
 - Dr. Rachel Showstack, Associate Professor of Spanish and Linguistics at WSU to help with communication of Spanish in healthcare. Know Your Rights as a Patient (first lesson). Workshops are once a month. Last will be held in June. KLC will bring some leadership skills to this as well. Plan to pilot Dec 2022 to assess what is working and what is not. Feedback is being obtained from participants in what would be helpful.
 - MARC converting curriculum to Spanish
 - Kansas Spanish speaking instructors: Diana Lady, Denise Romero, Crystal Rodriguez, Guadalupe Tredway, and Ton Miras are serving as translators to get materials and/or modules converted to Spanish?

- **Consider:** being cautious with translating as this should be looked at as Spanish as first language, if you will. If the individual isn't bilingual for both Spanish and English, this could pose issues when CHWs are working in the community.

- **Train the trainer update/support needed**
 - Thanks to the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, we have scholarship opportunities for the Kansas Community Health Worker Education Course.
 - *A CHW is a frontline public health worker who is a trusted member of and/or has an unusually close understanding of the community served. This trusting relationship enables the worker to serve as a liaison/link/intermediary between health/social services and the community to facilitate access to services and improve the quality and cultural competence of service delivery.*
A CHW also builds individual and community capacity by increasing health knowledge and self-sufficiency through a range of activities such as outreach, community education, informal counseling, social support, and advocacy. (American Public Health Association)
 - Community Health Workers (CHW), Community Health Advocates (CHA), Community Health Representatives (CHR), Care Coordinators, and Promotoras de Salud (PdS) are welcome.
