		Key indicator data should not be based on grant indicators to show CHW impact. Determine standard data points that KCHWC wants to collect from partners. This will show that we are meeting the needs of our clients and not only meeting the needs of the funders.
		Diana asked students in the current cohort. They responded that they are tracking food insecurity, chronic disease, diabetes, and access to testing for COVID-19. We will need more extensive information. For example: Are we tracking people who are receiving diabetes education? Are we tracking people who are receiving diabetes resources? Do we track ZIP, gender identity, age, etc.? What is the organization tracking to show success? Some standard data are being tracked or examples of indicators.
		Sedgwick County Health Department is working with Ascension Via Christi Emergency Department and hoping to align what data they are tracking with the needs of the program. They hope to show a decrease in the number of repeat visits of clients to the Emergency Department. Some examples include but are not limited to, # of annual prevention visits, # of referrals, # of "health access deserts," # of ED clients who receive referrals to primary care physicians, etc.
		Dr. Chrans shared the Key Indicators to Measure Success by Theme. Dr. Chrans will share the document to give to the participants. Data-sharing agreements will be distributed so that data can be easily exchanged.
		Crystal has been attending common indicators meetings with Noelle Wiggins. She will follow up and share any resources.
		CERTIFICATION VIDEO IDEA: Since certification is now relevant for CHW in Kansas. One idea for Kansas is to make a cartoon video. This is a new way to relate ideas. It needs to be fun and funny. Diana will ask internally, and Crystal will explore this idea with her team.
		Dr. Chrans will speak with Molly Gotobed about whether she can create a video for certification.
		Thanks to the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, there is no fee for certification through March of 2024.
