Join at 1:30 pm if you are interested. “Noelle Wiggins (she/her): Noelle has over 35 years’ experience working on teams that use popular/people’s education, the Community Health Worker (CHW) model, and participatory research and evaluation to advance health and educational equity. From 1986-1990, Noelle supported Community Health Workers (CHWs) in a rural area of El Salvador. She spent the next 5 years directing a CHW program in rural Oregon. Noelle served as Assoc. Director of the landmark Natl. Community Health Advisor Study and co-wrote the study chapter that identified the core roles of CHWs. Noelle co-founded the Community Capacitation Center at the Multnomah County Health Department and served as its director from 1998-2017. Noelle is currently the Co-Principal Investigator of the CHW Common Indicators Project. She has co-written multiple peer-reviewed publications about popular education and the CHW profession. Noelle has a BA from Yale University, an MS from the Harvard School of Public Health, and a doctorate in Educational Leadership from Portland State University.”</li> </ul>
