- Megan is reviewing the mentoring procedures to have the Mentoring Committee review the document to make it final.
- Not having a lot of people sign up. Evaluating promotional processes. Want to create a video to put on the website possibly. We are looking at creating a survey to identify reasons.

Health Occupation Students of America (HOSA) Conference Updates (Elaine, Jackie Catron, Sarahy)

- 675 students and 44 advisors
 - o Advisors are usually Family and Consumer Sciences, forensics, and biology instructors, among others.
 - o Students compete with presentations, etc.
 - O Vendor/exhibitor tables were available to any group.
 - o A large number of students attended from Southeast Kansas.
- 44 chapters and schools in Kansas
- Met at Kansas State University (KSU) on 10/4. This happens in Kansas twice each year. This was the first time that KSU hosted the event.
- HOSA Headquarters is the University of Kansas Medical Center Area Health Education Centers. HOSA: https://hosa.org/
- Sarahy, Jackie C., and Elaine talked to quite a few schools.
- Passed out business cards and education and Coalition information.
- Primarily want to introduce High School Juniors and Seniors to public health and have them trained as CHWs. Hope to have them support other students and their communities by addressing social determinants of health who have barriers to health.
- Great opportunity to promote health professions. For example, Kansas needs more dentists and diversity in health professions.

Dual Credit Course

- Kansas Board of Regents (KBOR) and Jackie Catron, KCHWC, and KSU are working together to create a pathway for receiving college credit for taking the course as a high schooler.
- May address some of the workforce shortages mentioned above.
- Similar to a Certified Nurses Aid course.
- Garden City High School is interested in offering the course. (Birgit and Crystal will follow up.) NOTE: There has previously been interest from Garden City Community College.
- The curriculum will need to be adjusted to be more engaging for high school students.
- Hoping to engage a CHW in the interested areas.
- Another potential model is a summer course to accommodate the schedules of high school students.

Offering Credit for KCHWC course

- KSU is offering an "Integrated Human Sciences" course for 3.0 credit hours
 - Elective
