- Jaime Perales Puchalt, PhD, MPH Director of the Latino Brain Health Lab, Assistant Director of KU Alzheimer's Disease Research Center to share briefly about his amazing project and about future trainings for CHWS on Alzheimer's
 - CuidaText
 - Dementia has a devastating impact for caregivers-physical, psychological (more depression and anxiety disorders) and financial
 - The prevalence of dementia is higher among Latinos vs. Non Latino-White
 - Large Latino population in Kansas
 - Kansas has 2 of the highest Alzheimer's prevalence counites among Latinos in the US- Haskell and

 Several interventions exist to improve the lives of families with dementia but exclude Latinos

Barriers

- Time constraints
- Unreliable transportation
- High cost
- Cultural barriers
- Text messaging as a solution to caregiver support- provides fidelity, effective, anywhere/anytime, low cost, personalized, private, and highly engaged
- Latinos are the highest users of text messaging vs NL
 White and NL Black

Development of CuidaTEXT

- Daily text message
- Keyword-driven messages (exp: stress)
- Live chat text messaging (ask for help)
- Booklet given at enrollment
- Topics: Education, caregiver, support, grief, solve, care, and behaviors

Evolution of CuidaText

- Alianza Latina(NIH-must be Latino, 6monhts)
- CareTEXT funded through MARC- 5
 Missouri families- do not have to be Latino
- CuidaTEXT efficacy
- Do not need health insurance or documentation
